

Built on the site of the former A-Listed Elgin Place Congregational Church, this iconic Glasgow landmark has been reimagined as an ultra-modern sanctuary for student living as opposed to a place of worship. Known as iQ Elgin Place, our design and build project, which took 88-weeks to complete, features 323 units of single occupancy studio rooms in a variety of configurations within 14-storeys, offering unparalleled student accommodation to Glasgow's thriving undergraduate community.

The Brief

Focused primarily on the provision of over 300 hotel-standard studio rooms, all finished to the highest specification levels, the client also required the Bath Street development to provide functional social amenity areas and accommodate 990m² of flexible retail space.

The Challenges

Inclusivity was the bedrock of our design focus and ensured that five-per-cent of the overall student accommodation was specifically constructed, and finished, to cater for physically impaired students. Furthermore, all of the standard rooms were completed with facilities for those with either hearing or visual impairments. Efficient, accountable management was also instrumental in our successful building approach within a very restricted, and sensitive, city centre location. Strict protocols were enforced to manage, and control, deliveries.

GRAHAM's added value solution

Opening its doors to students in September 2017, this £22 million Glasgow city centre design and build project features 323 selfcontained studio rooms (18m² – 20m²) and cluster flat rooms (14m²). Handed over on time and on budget, Elgin Place is characterised by a 'glass box' structure for the upper floors, which provides a contemporary new addition to Glasgow's skyline. The modern 14-storey building, featuring a large student amenity space, which is focused around a central atrium, also includes a rooftop bar and chill-out areas, a fully equipped gym, gaming room and a creative studio. Designed to enhance the student experience, it is also equipped with a film and presentation auditorium, private dining rooms, study areas and iPad bouncepads. Promoting innovation in project completion, we produced a hybrid concrete construction by integrating precast concrete, and in-situ concrete, which served to reduce the programme length while creating a high-quality finish.
